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## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Chapter Members,

Welcome FY 2013! They say FY 2012 was a pivotal year. What does that mean? Heck, I'm not entirely sure but it was certainly interesting ... and fun! In AETC we pivoted to a new way of looking at money resources. Out with the old, tired way of obligating as much and as quickly as possible and returning to the trough for more. Instead, let's think about what something costs, why it costs that much, and whether or not widget-A is more important than another widget-B as we labor to make the best use of limited dollars. We call it a Cost Conscious Culture and the momentum is just beginning to build as Airmen across the AETC enterprise are engaged in identifying smart ways of doing business to meet the challenge to save \$3 a day. An example ... A SSgt at Altus AFB asked, "Why do we spend \$23 on plastic straps used to secure equipment on our C-17s when those straps are prone to breakage and need to be changed out frequently?" Good question and the simple answer that met tech order requirements was to switch to web straps that cost 30 cents and are more reliable. So now it costs \$2 instead of \$120 per aircraft to swap out straps, along with fewer man-hours expended since web straps last longer and get changed out less often. Of course, that's just one example of some 300+ ideas our Airmen have generated with potential savings that gets us to our \$3/day challenge. And as financial professionals we provide the analysis to help decision makers understand the costs involved so decisions are not only operationally sound but also fiscally sound. Let me ask, "What have you done to save \$3 today?"

**CBO estimates final FY2012 budget deficit at almost \$1.1 trillion.** The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates that the final FY2012 federal budget deficit was almost \$1.1 trillion, slightly more than \$200 million lower than FY2011. The decline in the deficit resulted from a decrease in government spending (-\$59 billion) and higher revenues (+\$148 billion). When measured as a percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), the deficit dropped to 7 percent from 8.7 percent in FY2011 and 9 percent in FY2010. Even so, the FY 2012 deficit as a share of GDP was higher than that recorded each year from 1947 through 2008. ([Read the full story....](#))

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## CHAPTER MEETINGS

**October Meeting.** The luncheon, hosted by **Michelle Lester**, AFSVA VP, was held at the Lackland Gateway Club on **16 October 2012**. The speaker was **Jo Anne Dimitriou** (*photo on the right*), Division Chief for Plans and Force Management, Directorate of Services, Air Force Personnel Center. Ms. Dimitriou spoke about the realignment of the AFSVA as a Division under the AF Personnel Center, as well as the ongoing centralization of MAJCOM Installation Support (A1S) functions to the AF Services Division, resulting in a 64 percent reduction in personnel for these functions. Appropriated fund resourcing will remain at the MAJCOMs. Base-level support for the rest of the functions will be provided through a single call-in phone number with support from multiple subject matter experts and will use “Right Now Technology” (a case management tool) to provide fast, efficient service. In addition, all of the functions will undergo process mapping to optimize the flow of critical processes. The changes should be seamless to the supported Airmen and their families and will have virtually no impact on mission accomplishment. In closing, Ms. Dimitriou emphasized it’s incumbent on all of us to standardize and streamline our operations wherever we work to provide the most efficient support to our customers, while maintaining maximum mission effectiveness.

**Certified Defense Financial Manager (CDFM) Examination Information.** ASMC offers the CDFM program for individuals who demonstrate proficiency in the core aspects of defense financial management. The program is open to all civilian or military members of the Department of Defense, U.S. Coast Guard, or employees of defense contractors and suppliers who have met the required qualifications. To obtain the certification, the candidate must



adhere to the ASMC Pledge of Professionalism, have a high school diploma or equivalent, and successfully complete the required examination modules. In addition, the candidate must have completed a minimum number of years of financial management experience based on their academic background and submit a “Verification of Financial Management Experience” form to the ASMC National Certification Program Manager before they can be awarded a CDFM Certificate.

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# ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT

## **502d Air Base Wing FM to 502d CPTS (Joint Base San Antonio)**



Back in 2005, Congress (in an attempt to further reduce support costs and make the Services more efficient) identified 12 geographic areas with installations in close proximity to consolidate installation support functions. For the San Antonio area, this legislation included Fort Sam Houston, Randolph AFB, Lackland AFB, and Camp Bullis. This magnitude and scope of the largest DoD installation led to a unique organizational construct even for joint basing.

JBSA was designated an Air Force lead location for installation support and the 502d Air Base Wing (ABW) was established in July 2009 under the Air Education and Training Command. On 1 October 2010, Full Operating Capability (FOC) was achieved with the 802d Comptroller Squadron (CPTS), 902d CPTS, and 502d CPTS (Fort Sam Houston) organized and operational under the 502d ABW/FM. At Fort Sam Houston, the former Army Garrison Resource Management transitioned to an Air Force FM (CPTS). Let's look a little closer at the 502d FM organization that is unique in the Air Force.

A FM directorate was established under the 502d ABW Commander with three squadrons aligned under the directorate. The directorate consisted of a Director, Deputy Director, Budget Officer, Administrative Assistant, and three Budget Analysts. The 502d CPTS was stood up with a civilian director with the other two squadrons led by military commanders, all reporting to the FM director.

Under the current construct each squadron is triplicated – meaning we have 3 of each function – 3 QAs, 4 NAFFAs, 3 Budget officers, 5 Comptrollers (Director, Deputy Director, 502d CPTS/CL, 802d CPTS/CC and 902d CPTS/CC), etc., which led to an ineffective and inefficient organization. The entire ABW is going through a transformation to solve command and control issues plus becoming a more efficient and effective organization. FM is transforming to a standard Air Force Comptroller Squadron structure: command section, commander staff and orderly room, FMA, and FMF Flights. It will go from 5 comptrollers to 2 (CPTS Commander and deputy). Where many offices are triplicated, they will be reduced to one with personnel consolidating their efforts to perform those functions. In May 2012, AF moved Military Pay from the AFFSC back to the bases (with a net loss of 24 personnel throughout the AFFSC changes). The consolidated 502d CPTS serving JBSA will have some unique functions that no other AF CPTS has—TDY to School (supports the entire AF), Basic Military Training, Temporary Disability Retired List entitlements, and Defense Language Institute (pay foreign students). The 502d CPTS will be the largest Comptroller Squadron in the AF with the FMA and FMF flights larger than most other AF Comptroller squadrons.

Under the new structure, for FMF there will be a store front at each location (Randolph, Lackland, and Ft Sam Houston) providing direct face to face service. The FMF “Backshop” will process the phone calls, emails, and perform other financial services processes. FMA will have the budget, accounting, and integration sections. The accounting section will still provide accounting support to all AF tenants (160 OBANS, over \$8B).
