

I also know she will miss serving our Society, as her contributions to the growth, development, and achievements of ASMC over the past 22 years have been remarkable. I'm sure she has already received notes of appreciation from many of you, but if you were not aware she was leaving or have not had the opportunity to send her a note, I'm sure she looks forward to hearing from you.

Over the past two decades, I have seen this organization grow from a staff of two (myself and LTG McCall) to a staff of 10.5. Membership has grown by more than 4,000. Chapter leaders and PDI host committees have come and gone, building relationships and memories that will last a lifetime.

Federal procurement office requires agencies to improve their assessment of contractor performance. DoD issued guidance in November 2012 implementing Better Buying Power (BBP) 2.0, the Department's program to achieve greater efficiency and productivity in defense spending. BBP 2.0, identifies seven focus areas for improving the way DoD does business: achieving affordable programs; controlling costs throughout product lifecycles; incentivizing productivity and innovation in both government and industry; eliminating unproductive processes and bureaucracy; promoting effective competition; improving tradecraft in acquisition; and improving professionalism in the acquisition workforce (*Read the full story....*)

Annual Professional Development Institute Cancelled. Due to the Sequester of federal appropriations, the 2013 ASMC National PDI has been canceled. The ASMC staff and the National Executive Council are considering development of additional training and professional development opportunities for the near-term benefit of our membership. Simultaneously, they are taking a strategic look at PDI and other long term training opportunities and will develop a viable training and development program for the future of our society. Those, especially Certified Defense Financial Managers, who were planning to obtain CPE credits at the 2013 National PDI, should take advantage of other opportunities to fulfill required CPEs. These offerings include local ASMC chapter training events and programs offered through the Online Learning Center, such as the recent Sequestration webinar, PDI 2011 and PDI 2012 recorded sessions, as well as Armed Forces Comptroller journal articles. ASMC National is also developing an audio education series beginning with a "Discussion of the FY2014 DoD Budget" by *Mr. John Roth* which was held on Thursday, 25 April 2013 and "Congress and the Defense Budget: The Congressional Review Process" by which will be presented by *Mr. Bob Shue* on 15 May 2013.

Local Training Opportunities (see ASMC Training Website).

- The Air Force is hosting an *Enhanced Defense Financial Management Training Courses* (EDFMTCs) in San Antonio on *17-21 June 2013*. The EDFMTC is a five-day, intensive financial management review course taught in three modules. The course is provided by the Department of Defense and is licensed and copyrighted by the ASMC. *NOTE: ASMC cannot place you in one of the DoD centrally funded EDFMTC sessions, individuals interested in these sessions will need to work with the designated service POCs.*
- ASMC is sponsoring a <u>Module 4 Acquisition Business Management Course</u> on **2-3 May 2013** at the Fairfield Inn and Suites in Schertz. This course provides a two-day comprehensive overview of the rules governing the acquisition of major defense systems from the Program Manager's perspective. It incorporates the concepts and rules outlined in the Defense Acquisition Guidebook, as well as DoDI 500.02. The course is designed for DoD financial management personnel as well as those working the Acquisition field. The course may be used as a preparatory tool for the optional CDFM with Acquisition Specialty (CDFM-A). It may also be taken to increase personal knowledge in the subject

The speaker for the luncheon was Will Garrett, Vice President for Economic Development, San Antonio Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Garrett discussed initiatives and collaborative efforts between the Chamber of Commerce and local military activities. April Meeting. The Chapter luncheon was held on 23 April 2013 at the Lackland Gateway Club and was hosted by **Teresa Vega**, AFCEC VP. At the luncheon, **Glenda Scheiner**, SES, CDFM-A; Director, Human Capital and Resource Management; Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) provided a presentation on the **Defense Budget Status and DoD Financial Manager Certification Program**.

- **Defense Budget Status.** Although the Budget 2013 Appropriations Act was passed, the Sequester remains, with a \$41B cut. The Other Contingency Operations (OCO) funding was exempt from the Sequester, further compounding the problem for DoD. Ms. Scheiner described the near term actions, long term effects, and primary mission impacts of the sequester and potential future budget cuts. She stressed that the Sequester is inefficient and will have devastating effects on DoD. Finally, she said the FY2014 President's Budget was released on 10 April 2013. The USD(C)'s goals for this PB are to act as good stewards and to make people the central focus.
- **DOD FM Certification Program.** Tied to audit readiness program, this program will provide a standardized training framework to make good workforce better. The program will be course based, rather than test based, and will focus on 23 key FM competencies and the first 3 of 5 DoD leadership levels. The program applies to all military and civilian personnel in DOD FM (but not to contractor personnel), with all FM positions being coded into one of the 3 certification levels. No one will be grandfathered, but personnel will have 2 years to complete the program requirements (clock starts July 2014) (Limited time waivers may be available). Personnel can enter the program at any level and can receive credit for prior training, academic education, and experience. The program requires completion of various courses, most of which are available on-line in the DoD FM Learning Management System.



It also has "encouraged" elements, including a list of 20 test-based certifications. Personnel will be required to complete an alternate track either in a different discipline or at a different level. To prepare for the required FM certification, personnel should collect training records and certificates, check mapped courses, and begin taking available web-based training.

May Meeting. The monthly luncheon will be on Wednesday, **22 May 2013** at the Randolph Kendrick (NCO) Club and will be hosted by Ada Fromuth, 802 CPTS VP. At the luncheon, MAJ Joseph Topinka, MEDCOM Deputy Chief Staff Judge Advocate, will speak on Ethics (CDFMs require this training annually). Watch for more information in the event flyer.

June Meeting. This meeting will feature the Installation of Chapter Officers for 2013-**2014**, and will be hosted by **John Smith**, AFISRA VP.

Chapter members attended an audio-conference sponsored by ASMC National, in which Mr. John Roth, Deputy Comptroller for Budget, OUSD(C), spoke about the "Fiscal Year 2014 Budget Request FY 2013 Update" on 25 April 2013 at the 502 ABW/CPTS Conference Room on JBSA Ft. Microsoft Tips & Tricks Class. Teksouth has offered to provide 2 days (6 sessions) of Microsoft training, which will probably be held at the Education Service Center, Region 20. Chapter Members have been polled to determine level of interest and priorities for the Classes. Training on 18 June 2013 will be for Air Force/other, and training on 19 June **2013** will be for Army personnel due to the differences in the financial systems used by the different services. Space is limited to 30 people per course, so individuals will be placed in class(es) based on the priority they provided during our initial canvassing. ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT

Air Force Civil Engineer Center

The Air Force Civil Engineer Center, with its headquarters at JBSA - Lackland, is a field operating agency of the Air Force Civil Engineer. The Center is responsible for providing responsive, flexible full-spectrum installation engineering services. AFCEC missions include facility investment planning, design and construction, operations support, real property management, energy support, environmental compliance and restoration, and audit assertions, acquisition and program management. The unit conducts its operations at more than 75 locations worldwide.

- The **Director of Staff** manages and oversees mission support activities for the Air Force Civil Engineer Center, a field operating agency of the Air Force Civil Engineer. These activities include the execution of the public affairs, human resources management, protocol, civil engineering history, workflow, and strategic engagement programs. The director of staff is also responsible for strategic planning and initiatives, facility management, safety, emergency management, and the director's inspection program.
- The **Energy Directorate**, located at Tyndall AFB FL, consists of engineers, energy experts, contract officers and support staff who provide expertise to installations and major commands. They identify, evaluate and help implement technologies and funding strategies to reduce Air Force energy consumption and costs to meet federal energy goals.
- The **Environmental Directorate** is responsible for managing the Air Force restoration, compliance, sustainability and National Environmental Policy Act programs. The directorate also provides environmental technical assistance and advice to Air Force installations, major commands and other clients. The directorate develops execution strategies for environmental and sustainability issues, projects and programs based on best practices garnered from experience and research.
- The **Facilities Engineering Directorate** provides centralized facility design and construction for military construction, restoration and modernization, sustainment, and military family housing. The center implements standardized designs for similar facility and infrastructure types and seeks other cost-reduction strategies such as packaging multiple single-facility requirements into "whole facility investments" and regional acquisition efforts. The Air Force Comprehensive Asset Management Plan process enables the center and installation civil engineers to improve project delivery by increasing lead times for planning and design, ensuring earlier and more effective construction awards.
- The **Installations Directorate** conducts the strategic acquisition, management, and disposal of Air Force real property. It executes the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Installations' land and facilities policies through a full suite of services, including appraisals, lease renewals, licenses, easements, title opinions, environmental cleanup and transfer of property impacted by Base Realignment and Closure legislation, and other support services.
- The **Planning & Integration Directorate** provides a comprehensive framework to enable strategic and long-term planning for installation complexes to support the Air Force and its customers at the combined, joint, major command, and installation levels through development of investment strategies.



• The **Readiness Directorate** provides readiness and emergency services support to the Air Force civil engineer community through technical information and standardized methodology, enabling civil engineers worldwide to execute their expeditionary combat support and emergency services missions safely, effectively and efficiently.
