

NATIONAL NEWS

From the Executive Director, ASMC:

As you may recall, in my previous message concerning status of the ASMC National Professional Development Institute (PDI), I mentioned we were still planning to conduct the PDI in late May, due to the possibility that the sequestration issue would be resolved positively enough to enable the Department of Defense and the United States Coast Guard to fund training that is very important to the professional development of defense financial managers and contributes to their effectiveness in managing defense resources.

As you know, sequester of funds is now in effect, with passing of the March 1, 2013 deadline without an agreement, and the President having signed the sequester order. Clearly, now with sequestration in effect, we will not be able to conduct the National PDI at the end of May. However, over the next several weeks, it is possible that some type of positive resolution of sequestered funds could occur. Thus, we are in discussions with the Colorado Convention Center to conduct the PDI in Denver in August. Postponement of the PDI until August provides the additional time needed to resolve the current uncertainty of federal funding and also (if positive resolution occurs) to determine whether or not the DoD and the USCG have sufficient funds to support the contribution to defense financial management professional development that the PDI provides.

I will continue to closely monitor resolution of the sequestered funds situation and will provide a further update in late March, if not earlier. If sequestration remains in effect for a significant period of time, we will have to cancel the PDI altogether. However, as an optimist, I expect some resolution of sequestered funds over the next few weeks. Whether or not that resolution will enable consideration of funding of training below the "mission-critical" level remains to be seen.

Federal procurement office requires agencies to improve their assessment of contractor performance. Federal agencies have been directed to set "aggressive performance targets" to improve collection and use of information about contractor performance. In a <u>memo</u> to agency Chief Acquisition Officers (CAOs) and Senior Procurement Executives (SPEs) Joseph Jordan, head of the Office of Federal Procurement Policy (OFPP), underscored the importance of collecting and using information on contractor performance and integrity. Assessing government contractors' performance "is critical to informing source selection and award decisions and ensuring the government builds relationships with high-performing suppliers," he said. DoD FM Certification Program Newsletter. ASMC posted the first <u>DoD FM Certification Program Newsletter</u> to the National ASMC Web site. In addition to posting updated information via their FM Online Web site, the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) plans to issue quarterly newsletters providing the latest information about requirements, content and status of the program. ASMC is a strong proponent of demonstrating your professional credibility and excellence through credentials. Since the DoD FM Certification Program "recommends" defense financial managers have a certification for level two and "strongly recommends" a certification as part of level three, ASMC believes the Certified Defense Financial Manager (CDFM) program well complements the DoD FM Certification Program. The newsletter explains the eligibility requirements and benefits of the DoD FM Certification Program, along with quarterly trending statistics.

Local Training Opportunities (see ASMC Training Website).

- The Air Force is hosting two *Enhanced Defense Financial Management Training Courses* (EDFMTCs) in San Antonio. The first will be held *29 April 3 May 2013*, and the second will be *17-21 June 2013*. The EDFMTC is a five-day, intensive financial management review course taught in three modules. The course is provided by the Department of Defense and is licensed and copyrighted by the ASMC. *NOTE: ASMC cannot place you in one of the DoD centrally funded EDFMTC sessions, individuals interested in these sessions will need to work with the designated service POCs.*
- ASMC is sponsoring a <u>Module 4 Acquisition Business Management Course</u> on <u>2-3 May 2013</u> at the Fairfield Inn and Suites in Schertz. This course provides a two-day comprehensive overview of the rules governing the acquisition of major defense systems from the Program Manager's perspective. It incorporates the concepts and rules outlined in the Defense Acquisition Guidebook, as well as DoDI 500.02. The course is designed for DoD financial management personnel as well as those working the Acquisition field. The course may be used as a preparatory tool for the optional CDFM with Acquisition Specialty (CDFM-A). It may also be taken to increase personal knowledge in the subject matter. <u>Certification Reimbursement Programs</u>. In addition to our Incentive Award for Chapter Members who obtain their CDFMs, each of the services has programs to reimburse personnel for expenses incurred (registration and testing fees) in obtaining and/or maintaining these certifications. The **Air Force Medical Operations Agency** (**AFMOA**) oversees execution of the <u>Air Force Surgeon General</u> (AF/SG) policies supporting Air Force expeditionary capabilities, healthcare operations, and national security strategy. It provides expert consultative leadership support to 75 military treatment facilities and eight major commands to ensure cost-effective, modern, and prevention-based healthcare continuum for 2.6 million beneficiaries worldwide. The AFMOA directs and supports the clinical currency of 43,131 healthcare professionals providing 6.6 million visits and 133,500 bed days. It provides clinical and population health data and analysis to AF/SG and Major Command (MAJCOM) surgeons. The agency partners with the <u>Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs)</u>, <u>Secretary of the Air Force</u>, <u>Chief of Staff of the Air Force</u>, and the <u>Department of Veterans Affairs</u>.
