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


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

NATIONAL NEWS

GAO reports too many DoD contractors continue to perform inherently governmental work. DoD's inability to inventory its contracted services accurately means too many contractors are still performing inherently governmental work, according to a General Accountability Office (GAO) report. GAO has consistently contended that relying on contractors to support core missions "can place DoD at risk of contractors performing inherently governmental functions." This is the second of three annual reviews GAO is undertaking to determine how DoD is complying with a congressional mandate to use inventories of contracted services to determine how many contractors DoD employs and whether they are performing appropriate work. The report acknowledges that DoD has improved its process to inventory service contractors and their work, but states the department has to do much more to ensure that it fully complies with congressional direction. AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

The Alamo City Chapter members are fortunate once again to receive recognition as winners of ASMC, Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller), and Assistant Secretary of the Army (FM&C) awards, as shown below. The awards will be presented during the National ASMC Professional Development Institute in Anaheim CA.

➤ **ASMC National Awards:**

- **Meritorious Award, Intern/Trainee (MAJCOM or Higher).** **Courtney Chin**, AETC/FM. Ms. Chin epitomizes the internship experience. Her accomplishments included identifying sources for emerging requirements, developing an integrated database to track documents and funds, preparing her accounts for AF audit readiness, presenting a class on the management of appropriated funds, analyzing alternatives for Continuing Resolution funds, and tracking OCO requirements, all while earning her MBA.
- **Meritorious Award, Accounting and Finance (MAJCOM or Higher).** **Arturo Lomas**, MEDCOM. As a Lead Accountant for MEDCOM, Mr. Lomas identified and corrected \$66M in overstated obligations, liquidated more than 66 thousand unliquidated obligations worth \$941M, and was in the top 10% of Army's major commands by surpassing many of the Army's financial management metric goals.
- **Meritorious Award, Auditing.** **Tamara Lewis-Ibrahim**, AFAA/SP. Ms. Lewis-Ibrahim, an Air Force auditor from San Antonio, TX, identified nearly \$4 million in unnecessary costs to mobilize Air Force Reserve and National Guard Personnel. High cost for all Services, program receives little scrutiny. Very timely audit work with DoD-wide implications.
- **2011-2012 ASMC Contest Essay, Third Place Winner.** **Jeffrey P. Moon**, MEDCOM. Mr. Moon's essay examined the Department of Defense (DoD) goal of realizing



approximately \$100 billion in savings over the next five years while maintaining our vital strategic defense responsibilities in a complex international environment. In the essay, Mr. Moon identified several proposals for savings, which could form the foundation for long-term cost control measures. Army North Efficiencies Tiger Team is selected as the winner of the 2011 Resource Management Awards Program as the Outstanding Resource Management Team Award (at or above the Army Command level). The team was charged with identifying and implementing command-wide efficiencies to posture Army North to a more efficient, effective and cost-conscious business model. Supporting Secretary of Defense and Army Efficiency Initiatives, the team identified over 20 actions saving Army North more than \$3M in FY 2011. CDFM CORNER

- **CDFM Examination Information.** ASMC offers the CDFM program for individuals who demonstrate proficiency in the core aspects of defense financial management. The program is open to all civilian or military members of the Department of Defense, Coast Guard, or employees of defense contractors and suppliers who have met the required qualifications. To obtain the certification, the candidate must adhere to the ASMC Pledge of Professionalism, have a high school diploma or equivalent, and successfully complete the required examination modules. In addition, the candidate must have completed a minimum number of years of financial management experience based on their academic background and submit a “Verification of Financial Management Experience” form to the ASMC National Certification Program Manager before they can be awarded a CDFM Certificate. - **Certified Defense Financial Management (CDFM) Training.** The Chapter is considering a number of options for providing CDFM training for our *Chapter members*, such as sponsoring a local EDFMT course, holding one-day CDFM workshops (like the sessions we had on Saturdays last year), sponsoring the audio-conferences provided by National ASMC, or coordinating brown-bag lunch training sessions. These options aren’t mutually exclusive, but we need to determine which of the options have sufficient interest to pursue further. We’re currently in the preliminary discussion phase and need to work out a number of issues, such as funding arrangements (how much the Chapter can subsidize and how much each member or organization would need to fund). Please let your Organization VP know if you’d be interested in participating in any of the CDFM training options we’re considering or if you have any additional options you’d like us to consider. Keep in mind that you would need support from your organization to participate in any of the training activities held during duty time.

ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT



U.S. ARMY SOUTH (ARSOUTH)

U. S. Army South’s (ARSOUTH) primary mission as the Army Service Component Command for U.S. Southern Command (USSOUTHCOM) is to conduct theater security cooperation to enhance hemispheric security and stability, and build partner nation capacity. ARSOUTH is also prepared to deploy and conduct contingency operations in the Central America, South America, and the Caribbean area of operations. These functions are executed with an annual budget of over \$180M from various appropriations (Operations & Maintenance, Army; Other Procurement, Army; Military Pay, Army and Office of Sec Def).



ARSOUTH was initially designated by the commander of USSOUTHCOM and also HQDA to execute post captivity reintegration responsibilities. The Personnel Recovery Coordination Cell (PRCC), part of the command's G-3 (operations) directorate, received best practice recognition from the Department of the Army and was recently designated as the executive agent for planning, leading and coordinating reintegration efforts Army-wide.

Reintegration is a proven successful process that provides recovered personnel, service members, civilians or contractors, with the necessary tools to effectively resume normal professional, family, and community activities, with minimal physical and emotional complications.

Since 2003, ARSOUTH has planned, rehearsed and participated in the reintegration efforts of six personnel, who were either held as hostages, missing, or were separated from friendly forces.

With the successful establishment of the program here, ARSOUTH, working with Joint Base San Antonio, is also being considered as the primary DoD location for reintegration for all services. The U.S. Navy formally designated Joint Base San Antonio and Brooke Army Medical Center as one of its reintegration locations for its service members and asked for Army South's assistance for a future reintegration mission.

The PRCC is also responsible for pre-deployment training of personnel travelling in the AOR. ARSOUTH was the first Army command with a full-time PRCC staff dedicated to leading an organized approach to reintegrating personnel. The PRCC staff first executed a reintegration operation in August 2007, when an American (Department of the Army) contractor held in Ethiopia for almost three months was returned to friendly forces. The second time was in 2008 when Marc Gonsalves, Thomas Howes and Keith Stansell, Army contractors who were held captive in Colombia for more than five years, were safely returned. The third reunion took place in 2010 when a DA Army civilian held in captivity for two months in Iraq was also safely returned.

In January of this year ARSOUTH's PRCC assisted with the successful reintegration of a U.S. airman who was kidnapped in Venezuela.

The PRCC conducts formal reintegration training for ARSOUTH's staff and all joint and interagency organizations involved in the process at least twice a year here. In addition, the PRCC incorporates training scenarios into ARSOUTH and USSOUTHCOM exercises.

The training integrates the efforts of family assistance teams, medical personnel, public affairs officers, security specialists, chaplains, attorneys, logisticians, personnel, finance, federal bureau investigators, State department representatives, government contractors, DoD civilians and joint military personnel from Lackland Air Force Base and Fort Sam Houston.
